- Report from Racial Disparities Workgroup
 - o Community meeting with full group was last week.
 - Received results from focus groups.
 - o Framework for community process/next steps will tie in with Blueprint plan.
 - Making progress toward implementing ideas.

- PIT Count
 - Recruiting volunteers; 3 team leaders have signed up so far.
 - o Working on updating PIT training listening session.
 - o HMIS team is updating forms.
 - o Deployment sites and teams have been established.
 - o COVID testing kits for entering shelters are needed for volunteers.
 - Elizabeth will share contact info to reach out to Lawrence Tech nursing students, and first responders: sheriff's department, EMTs.
- Blueprint Workgroup Rollout

 - After the New Year, Alliance will be organizing groups to collaborate implementation.
 - o Homeless Healthcare group offered to help support with collaboration and report outs.
 - County will help with media releases, community engagement.
 - County would like a number of affordable units to develop.
 - Workgroups will be working on developing number of units/prices needed.
 - Tiffany is researching FMR and Washtenaw County is higher in all categories, and we plan to look into process/next steps to ask to join the grouping with Washtenaw.
- CERA Press Release with Client Survey Info
 - Legislature has still not appropriated CERA round 2 funding.
 - o Round 1 will run out of funds in a couple of months.
 - The report/highlights can be made available to reporters. May wait to release when round 2 funds become available.
 - Would like to highlight a direct client story from someone willing to go on camera to share their experience. An opportunity to break stereotypes of who received assistance with a relatable example.
