# REQUEST FOR PROPOSALS New Bonus Domestic Violence (DV) Transitional Housing Project (TH)

The Alliance for Housing, Oakland County's Continuum of Care (CoC) is requesting proposals for funding under the U.S. Department of Housing and Urban Development (HUD) Continuum of Care Homeless Assistance Program. **This is for new DV-TH projects.** See the FY 2025 NOFO for full requirements. The new bonus amount for Oakland County DV bonus is estimated at \$644,142. This grant requires a 25% match (in-kind or cash). Multiple projects may be awarded.

If you have a current DV-TH or DV-RRH project, it is not eligible for renewal. The agency must apply for new funding under this RFP.

#### **Project Design (18 points)**

# **Project Model, Structure, and Service Design (8 points)**

- **0–2:** Minimal or unclear
- **3–5:** Moderate clarity; some best practices
- **6–8:** Strong, detailed, HUD-aligned DV-TH model

# **Coordinated Entry Integration (5 points)**

- **0–1:** Vague CE connection
- **2–3:** Reasonable but lacking detail
- 4-5: Strong CE integration, prioritizes unsheltered

## Staffing Plan, Coverage, and Supervision (5 points)

- **0–1:** Insufficient staffing
- **2–3:** Adequate/Near acceptable
- **4–5:** Full coverage, strong supervision, appropriate ratios

## **Prior Experience & Performance (10 points)**

#### Prior DV-TH/Housing Experience OR Demonstrated Plan (7 points)

- **0–2:** Weak or missing outcomes/plan
- **3–5:** Moderate performance/plan
- **6–7:** Strong historical outcomes OR strong credible plan

## **Mainstream Benefits Connections (3 points)**

- **0–1:** Vague plan
- **2:** Adequate
- **3:** Strong system with partnerships and clear process



# **Cost Effectiveness & Budget (8 points)**

# Cost Reasonableness per 2 CFR 200.404 (5 points)

- **0-1:** Unclear or unreasonable
- **2–3:** Mostly reasonable
- **4–5:** Strong rationale, efficient, aligned with services

# Match Requirement ≥25% (3 points)

- **0–1:** Missing/insufficient match
- 2: Minimum met
- 3: Fully documented, stable match sources

# **Program Operations & Community Coordination (9 points)**

- 0: Unclear
- 1: Clear and appropriate

## **Coordination with Law Enforcement/Outreach/First Responders (4 points)**

- **0–1:** Minimal
- **2–3:** Some coordination
- **4:** Strong partnerships/clear protocols

- **0–1:** Weak or unclear

# **Total Score: 50 points**

# Minimum thresholds:

- HUD-required sections must still score ≥7/10 (≥3.5/5 when scaled) on those items.
- Recommended overall threshold: **38+ points** to be competitive.

Applicants that are rejected may also appeal directly to HUD by submitting a Solo Application prior to the deadline per the 2025 NOFO.
